**Address from UN Headquarters, New York: Ms. Amina J. Mohammed, Deputy Secretary-General, United Nations**

Ms. Amina J. Mohammed is the Deputy Secretary-General of the United Nations and Chair of the United Nations Sustainable Development Group. Prior to her appointment, Ms. Mohammed served as Minister of Environment of Nigeria where she steered the country's efforts on climate action and protection of natural environment. Ms. Mohammed first joined the United Nations in 2012 as Special Adviser to former Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon. In this role, she achieved the establishment of the Sustainable Development Goals. Ms. Mohammed began her career as an advocate for education and social services in Nigeria before moving into the public sector. She has advised four successive Presidents on poverty, public sector reform, and sustainable development.



**H.E. Ms. Bulgantuya Khurelbaatar, Minister of Labour and Social Protection, Mongolia**

H.E. Ms. Bulgantuya Khurelbaatar is a Member of The Parliament of Mongolia and Minister for Labour and Social Protection. She chairs the Sub-Committee on Sustainable Development Goals and has worked as Deputy Chairman of Mongolian People's Party Caucus of the Parliament. Before being elected as a member of Parliament, she worked as the Vice Minister of Finance of Mongolia from 2016 until 2020, overseeing Mongolia's macroeconomic and financial policies, budgetary and investment policies. Prior to joining the Ministry of Finance, she served as a Secretary of Mongolian People's Party in charge of Party Structure, International Relations and non-government institutions.



**Ms. Pamela Coke-Hamilton, Executive Director, International Trade Centre**

Since her appointment as Executive Director of the International Trade Centre in 2020, Ms. Coke-Hamilton has led the agency to meet the economic and trade challenges posed by the Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent global supply chain disruptions. Ms. Coke-Hamilton has a breadth of experience and expertise in trade-related capacity-building and sustainable development and a deep understanding of the challenges faced by vulnerable economies. She also established the *Women Empowered through Export* platform to address the disadvantages facing women-owned firms. She began her career in Jamaica's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade, and served as Director of Trade, Tourism and Competitiveness of the Organization of American States and as Executive Director of the Caribbean Export Development Agency.



**Mr. Duuren Tumenjargal, Chief Executive Officer, Mongolian National Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Mongolia**

Mr. Duuren Tumenjargal is a graduate of the University of Delhi of India with a degree in Economics. From 2000 to 2019, he was the Head of the Marketing Department of the MCS Group, Deputy Director of the UFC Group, Deputy Director of Capitron Bank, and Advisor to the Minister of Environment and Tourism. Since 2019, he has been the CEO of the Mongolian National Chamber of Commerce and Industry. Mr. Duuren has initiated and implemented export promotion projects and programs to develop the agricultural raw materials processing sector, support non-mining exports and to establish an export financing system and develop export clusters. He also represented the private sector in the working group to develop the New Recovery Policy of the Mongolian Government.



**Master of Ceremonies: Ms. Yeruu Dorjderem, Director of Business Academy, Mongolian National Chamber of Commerce and Industry**

Yeruu Dorjderem is the director of the Business Academy of MNCCI and a founder of United Management Consulting LLC, a business consulting and coaching firm. She has worked for the German Development Cooperation, Regional Economic Development Programme and initiated the first local Economic Forum in Darkhan-2012 and participated in the Darkhan International Economic Forum-2016 and an Executive Summit among c-level executives. Ms. Dorjderem was also responsible for introducing ISO 9001 standards to several Mongolian provinces, or "aimags". She is an active member of JCI Mongolia and graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Business administration from National University of Mongolia
